1st of October: the International Day of Older Persons



The year 2020 marks the 75th Anniversary of the United Nations and the 30th Anniversary of the International Day of Older Persons (UNIDOP). The theme chosen by the United Nations for this year is: "Pandemics: Do They Change How We Address Age and Ageing?". For more background information about this day and the UN; click here.

At the end of August (30/10) we have sent you a letter from our president on the occasion of this day, we are sending you this letter again as a reminder in annex. Our letter was sent to EPP President Donald Tusk, Secretary General Antonio López-Istúriz, President of the Commission Ursula von der Leyen and European Commissioner for Democracy and Demography Dubravka Šuica. In addition, we have also sent this letter to the EPP members of the Parliamentary Committee on Employment and Social Affairs, Human Rights and Environment and Public Health and Food Safety. We hope that they also will call for a fair and resilient society where no one is left behind.

Preparing the 25th anniversary of the ESU

The history should be remembered

The members of the Czech Christian Seniors' Association - SKS regularly take part in important historical events. This year they have made a significant contribution to co-organising the meeting in memory of the special military units PTP for politically unreliable men during the totalitarian Communist regime established only 70 years ago, in September 1950. At the time, these men were considered enemies of the ruling Communist Party. Every year, traditional commemorative meetings are organised with the respective government bodies, local authorities and NGOs. Because of COVID-19, the size of the meeting was modest.

In her speech, Lidmila Němcová, on behalf of the SKS, stressed the need to pass on to young people the personal experiences of our senior members, as well as the democratic way of thinking and acting. Genuine objective history needs to be remembered, intergenerational cooperation is necessary and a fragile democracy in our country needs to be cultivated.
