ESU-Madrid-Congress 23-25 September 2021: A triptych in Madrid

→ 'Building the future together': Seniors focusing on EU's political priorities



On 23-25 September, the ESU was finally able to celebrate its 25th anniversary after a one-year delay. For this purpose, we met in Madrid, the venue was well chosen because it was also in Madrid that the organization was founded in 1995. It was a warm gathering with our 'Christian democratic family' after

being separated for so long by the COVID-19 pandemic. **"Building the future together".** Our message was loud and clear at the congress in Madrid; read the report of the congress <u>here</u>. In this report, we highlighted some aspects of the Congress programme: the reflection and discussions on the future of the EU, "A quarter of a century of active

The ESU Congress in Madrid was a celebration that served as a sharpening of our focus on the future. In 1995 the first ESU-Congress took place in Madrid. ESU vice-president Carmen Quintanilla was proud

to welcome the participants again in the Spanish capital after a quarter of a century of tumultuous European developments and intensive seniors' involvement in political decision-making.

The celebration of the 25th anniversary of the ESU in Madrid was coupled with an Extraordinary Congress. It took place on 24th September in the afternoon. Our president An Hermans opened the afternoon session with hopeful words for a future-oriented ESU: *"Standing together and looking in a same direction, we can build a strong, resilient and sustainable future: without discrimination, without ageism & in solidarity."*

We started with the amendments to the ESU Statutes and Rules of Procedure. The presentation of the proposed changes for the ESU Executive Committee, questions from the delegates & the final vote on the changes, all this was prepared and moderated by our Secretary General Guido Dumon. Our ESU was welcomed in Cyprus: What a week!



Our ESU Vice-President Antonios Demetriades, who is also the President of the Senior Citizens Organization of Cyprus invited (OSCC), ESU President An Hermans and Secretary-General Guido Dumon to participate in an event to mark the United Nations International Day of Older Persons (UNIDOP) and to make some contacts with leading

persons in politics to discuss policy issues related to older people. It was about: long-term care, fighting poverty and loneliness, cooperation between generations, digitalization...

We exchanged views about the role of seniors in society, their active participation, and their need for care with Averof Neophytou and Harris Georgiades, President and Vice President of the political party DISY. They both underlined the important role of seniors in their party and the importance of cooperation at the European level when it comes to geopolitical problems. In Limassol, - 'the most southern city of the EU' according to Savvas Stouppas- we visited a non-governmental initiative to

respond to psychological and cultural needs of seniors. Very interesting was the visit to the University and the clear proposal of Prof. Panayiotis Zaphiris, rector of the Technical University of Limassol to develop activities together. We will certainly explore this idea further. We had several visits and exchanges with local board members of seniors' associations speaking about their



activities in the association and telling what several decades of Turkish occupation in the North of Cyprus meant for their personal life and that of their families.

Our visit to Kyriacos Kokkinos, Deputy Minister to the President and responsible for Research, Innovation and Digital Policy, took us to the heart of our recent concern about "digital equality for all". The minister explained the ambitious plan to optimise digital participation for all and how seniors will be able to take advantage of the support and coaching offered in local communities.





The "highlight" of the whole week was a meeting in a large auditorium "Cine Studio" of the University of Nicosia on the occasion of the UNIDOP. Our host was Prof. Constantinos N. Phellas, Vice-Rector of the University. The Speaker of the House of Representatives, Annita Demetriou took the event under her wing. An important delegation of Cypriot seniors and representatives from the political, economic, and cultural sectors of society gathered and enjoyed several speeches that all emphasized the role of seniors and the need for

cooperation between generations to develop a sustainable, fair and inclusive society. Professor An Hermans, one of the speakers, addressed the role of the EU in tackling demographic change. And... as ESU Vice-President Antonios Demetriades said "We are sure that these recent meetings will certainly have repercussions for the ESU, at the European level as well as in Cyprus."
